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OFFICIATING OPPORTUNITIES IN TRACK AND FIELD

Field of Play - Track Officials Jobs

- Marshalling organizing athletes into their lanes/starting orders and handing them over to the start crew; keeps track events on time
- Umpires watching for lane and race infractions as athletes compete
- Starting shooting the gun, calling false starts, assisting with marshalling (sometimes)
- Finish line finish orders, lap counting, back up timing (sometimes)
- Call Room checking athletes into events, checking spikes and equipment bags
- Verify records

Field of Play - Field Officials Jobs

- Jumps and Throws
- Measure throws and/or jumps
- Verify performance and records
- Verify jumps or throws are legal
- This area allows for more interaction with the athletes
- Keep events on time
- Insure bar in PV and HJ is at the proper height

Photo Timing and Results (Technology)

- Results (work with Hy-Tek Software and Trackie online to set up meet entries, set up heats/flights and finals and submit results to Athletics Canada)
- Display boards
- Photo timing (track results)

Skill Set

- Ability to work as a team member
- Pleasant with good customer service skills
- Willing to take direction from other volunteer leaders
- Willingness to learn

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<u>ATHLETICS MANITOBA OFFICIALS DEVELOPMENT PATHWAY – LEVEL 1 AND 2</u>

General Notes

- Classroom instruction <u>does not</u> have to precede the practical experience
- At the completion of level 1 a name tag will be provided that identifies the new official as part of the officials group
- Upon completion of Level 2 officials will be provided with a white golf shirt
- When training as an official or serving in an officiating role navy pants or shorts and a white golf shirt should be worn at all times.
- Officiating hours will be tracked manually on the officials meet record card

Level 1 Field of Play (practical experience does not have to precede classroom instruction)

- 1. 12 hours of practical experience at three different track meets; it is encouraged that the 12 hours of practical experience be across different event group areas
- 2. 3 hours of classroom instruction

Level 2 Field of Play (practical experience does not have to precede classroom instruction)

- 1. 40 hours of practical experience
- 2. 4-5 hours of classroom instruction, providing an overview of all areas of track and field
- 3. Completion of the Athletics Canada Level 2 online module in a chosen event group area (more than one event group can be selected)

Level 1 Photo Timing (there is a specific order to the activities)

- 1. 1 hour introductory session plus 3 hour in-person practical session at the track (University of Manitoba). This is done outside of formal competition to familiarize everyone with the photo timing gear
- 2. Practical training at track meets: 12 hours over 3 different meets and gaining experience in the following areas: setup, operation and tear down

Level 2 Photo Timing (the order of the classroom sessions does not matter)

- 1. 40 hours of practical experience in the photo timing area across a number of meets and gaining experience in the following areas: setup, operation and tear down
- 2. 4-5 hours of classroom instruction, providing an overview of all areas of track and field
- 4-5 hours of classroom instruction at the track (University of Manitoba). This will focus on the rules and principles of photo timing as well as trouble shooting common problems and more training on the setup, operation and tear down of the equipment
- 4. Completion of the Athletics Canada Level 2 online module specific to photo timing

Level 1 Results (Hy-Tek) (there is a specific order to the activities)

- 1. 3 hour in-person introduction to Hy-Tek Software.
- 2. 12 hours of experience at track meets doing results

Level 2 Results (Hy-Tek) (the order of the classroom sessions does not matter)

- 1. 5-7 hours of classroom instruction (networking, meet set up and seeding)
- 2. 4-5 hours of classroom instruction, providing an overview of all areas of track and field
- 3. 40 hours of practical experience in meet set up and results management across a number of meets
- 4. Completion of the Athletics Canada Level 2 online module specific to results.
